Tips:

NEVER use absolute file paths in scripts or Markdown

Absolute path: how to get to the file from the computer's root directory

Mac: /Users/wilcoxen/.../g01-github-pjw-demo/results.md

PC: C:/Users/wilcoxen/.../g01-github-pjw-demo/results.md

These guarantee your code WILL NOT run on other computers Also, code WILL NOT work if directory names are changed


What I see if you use an absolute path:



Traceback (most recent call last):
 File "hello2_file.py", line 12, in <module>
   fh=open (filename,"w")
FileNotFoundError: [Errno 2] No such file or directory: '/Users/ /Documents/GitHub/g02-helly-
```

Always use paths relative to script

Relative path: how to get to the file from the current working directory

Example: referring to images from demo.md in FolderB:





Case	Image	Explanation
1	dog.png	In same directory, no path needed
2	FolderD/cat.png	In child directory
3	/parrot.png	In parent directory
4	/FolderC/horse.png	In sibling directory

In Markdown **spaces can matter** (shown with below):

Markdown	Meaning	Approximate Rendering
# Something	Markdown: Level 1 (large) heading	Something
#Something	No space: plain text	#Something
Something	Markdown: Emphasis (bold in Slack, WhatsApp)	Something
Something	Markdown: Emphasis (italics in Slack, WhatsApp)	Something
Something	Markdown: Strong emphasis	Something
* Something *	No space: plain text	* Something *

* ☐ Something ☐ * No space: plain text	* Something *

Super important place where spaces matter: file names in links

• TL;DR version:

DO NOT use spaces or punctuation other than - and _ in file names:

No	Yes
My Puppy.png	MyPuppy.png
My(Adorable!)Kitten.jpg	My-Adorable-Kitten.jpg

• Long version:

Spaces and punctuation can be included with extra work ... but it's not a good idea
